Apostille is a special stamp which appears on official outgoing documents of the countries participating in the Hague Convention. The adoption of the apostille approved by the Hague Convention for canceling the requirements for legalization of foreign official documents of 5 October 1961. The apostille is intended to certify the signature and the authenticity of all seals and stamps which are affixed to the document. Apostille is affixed on documents as originals and the copies testified in a notarial order. The effect of the Hague Convention applies to the following types of documents of civil status. Apostille may be placed in a few special cases. Apostille shall be affixed to the following documents: originals. The apostille is not affixed to the following documents: Usually apostille is affixed on documents in places free from the text on the reverse side or on a separate sheet. If the apostille is affixed on a separate sheet, it must be attached to the documents. The number of stitched or stapled pages shall be signed by the authorized person placing the apostille. After certification by Apostille or in cases when you do not need legalization of documents to be translated, papers and correctness of the translation shall be certified by a notary public or by a private notary or a public notary or consular institutions of the Russian Federation. The certificate shall be issued within 5-7 working days as standard. Are expedited Apostille. IN THE BEGINNING Legalization of documents To give the document legal force on the territory of other countries require legalization of documents and provision of documents in various organs of a state. To perform the procedure of legalization of the document you want to produce a list of necessary formalities and procedures as the documents issued on the territory of the Russian Federation are valid only in Russia. The legalization of the exposed documents of other countries with which the Russian Federation has not signed a basic bilateral agreement on the abolition of legalisation of documents. The procedure of legalization of documents can be made only in the territory of the country of registration or issuance. If the document cannot be legalized, you must obtain his certificate from the Consulate of the destination country and the CCI. If the document shall be legalized and the country is party to the Hague Convention, this document will be sufficient. Apostille. If a country is not party to the Hague Convention, for the completion of the process of legalization of the document will need consular legalization. If the establishment in the country of destination does not require legalisation or
